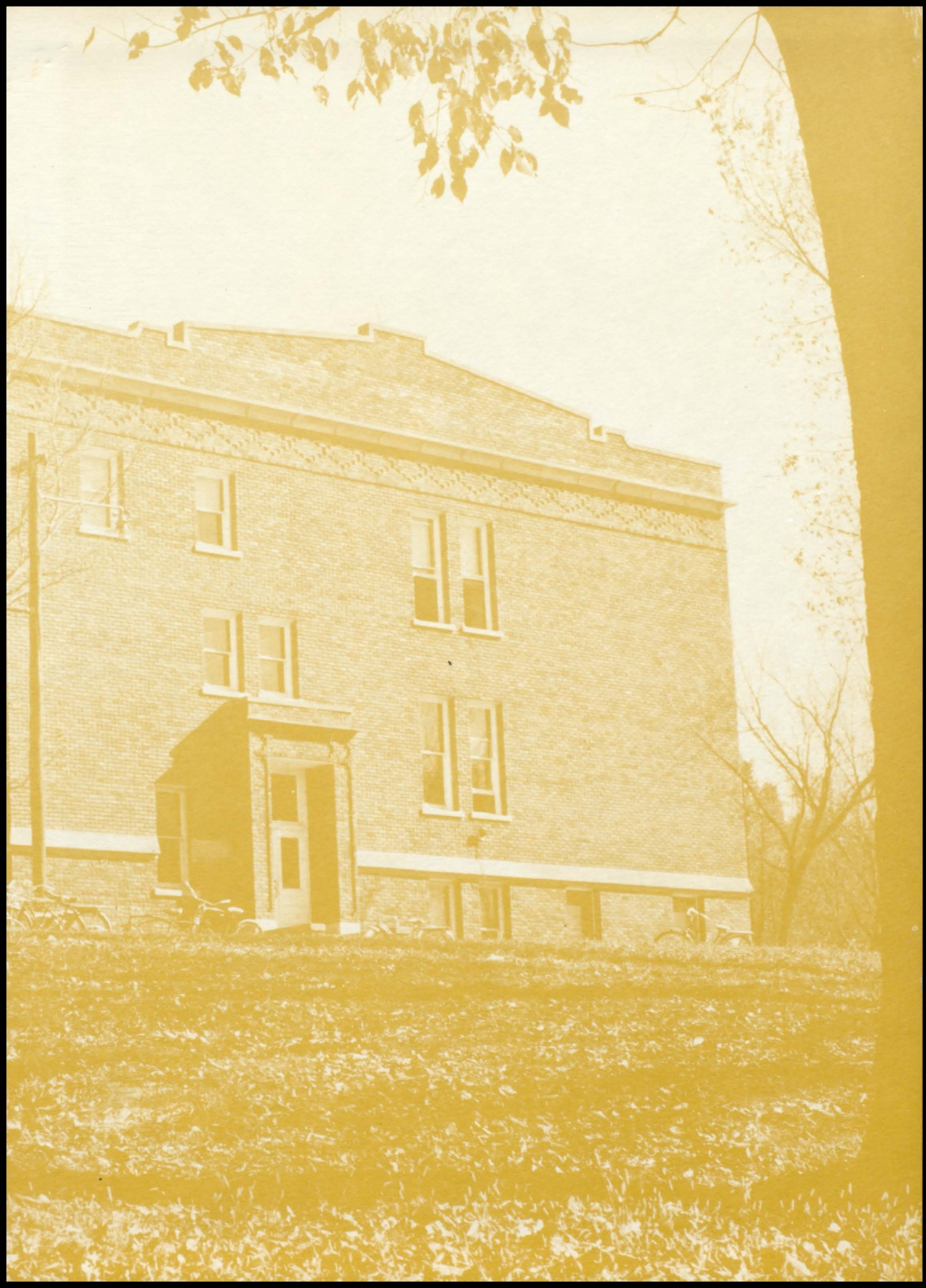


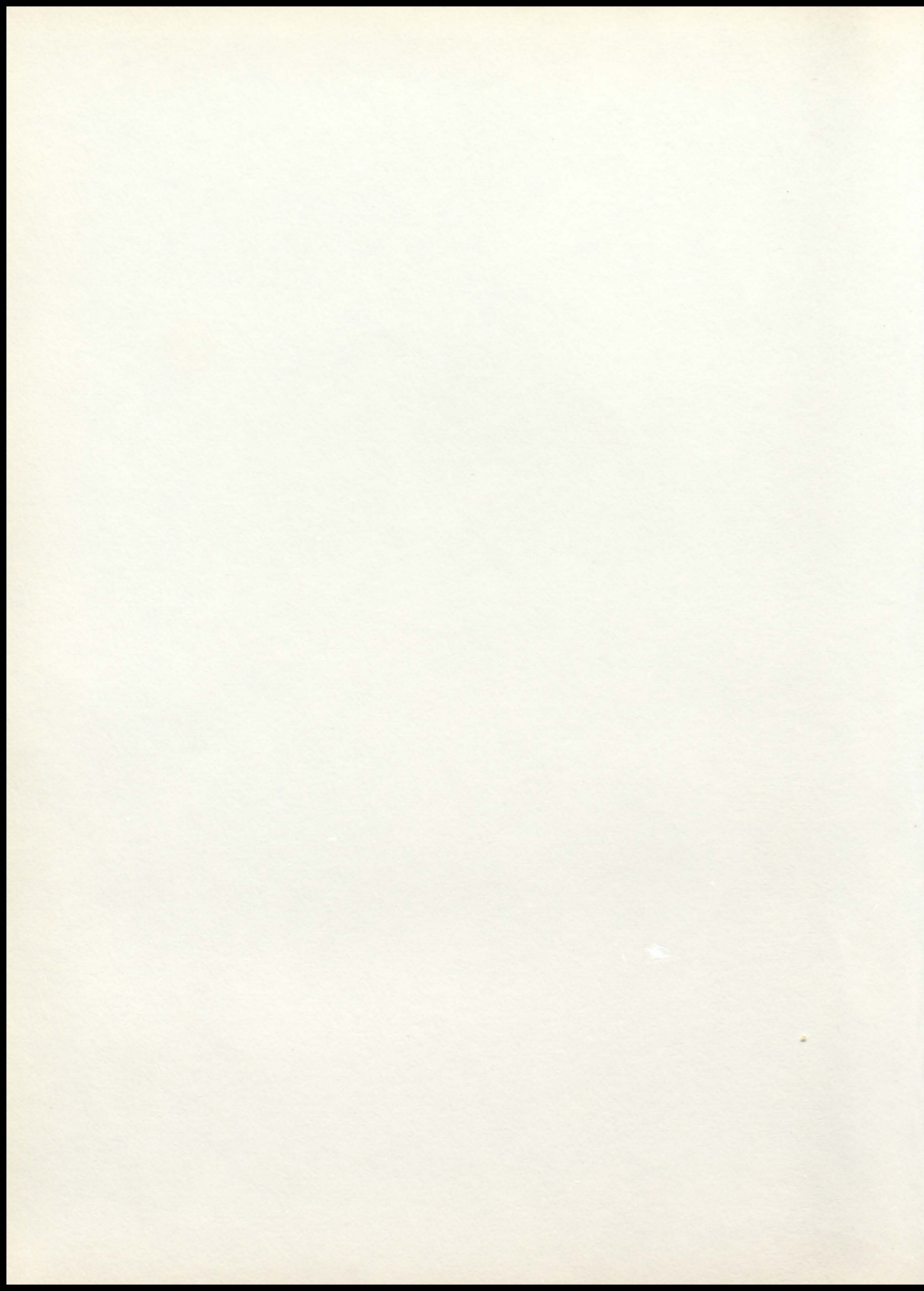

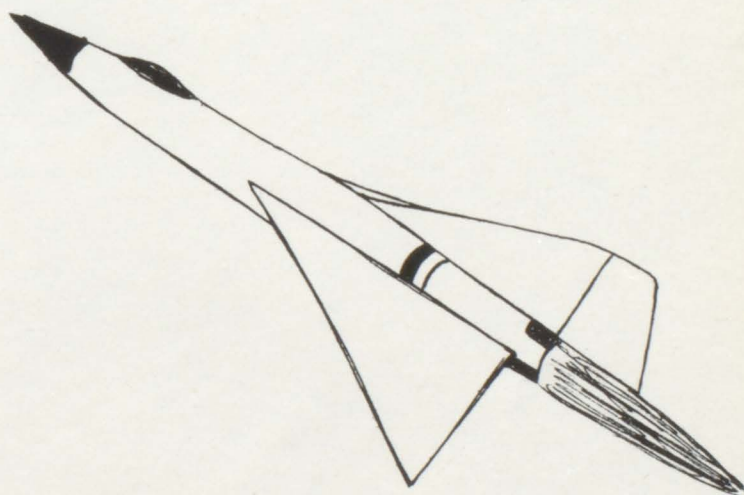








Dedication

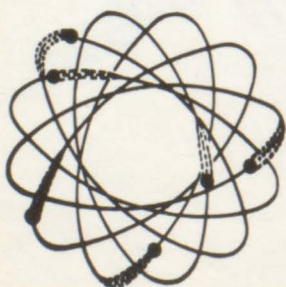

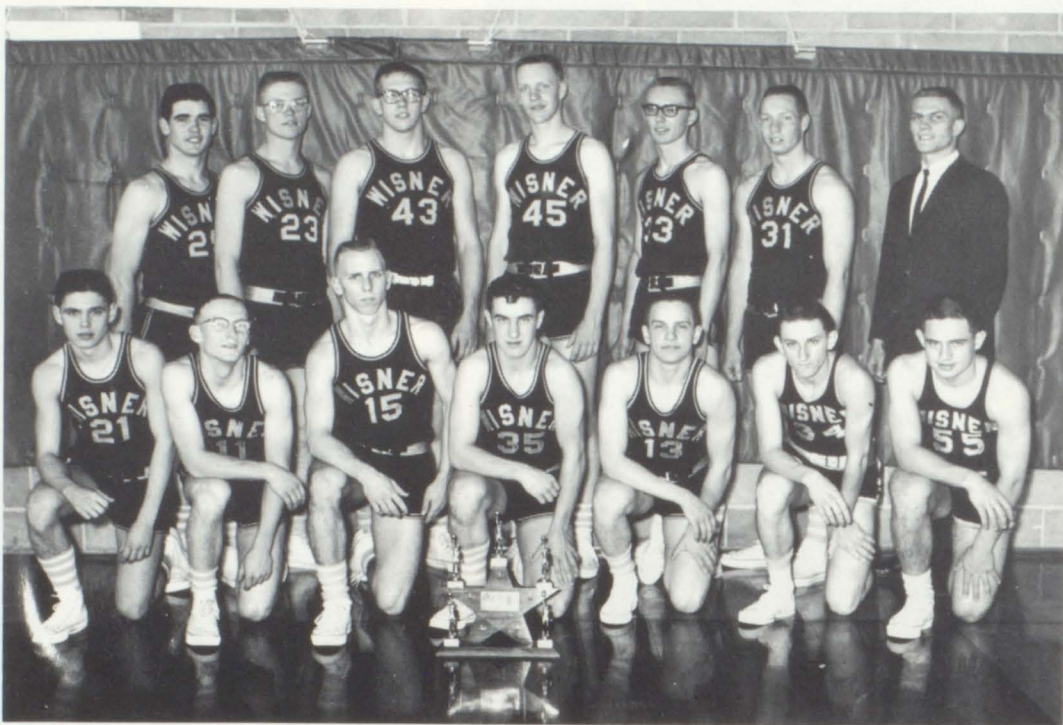

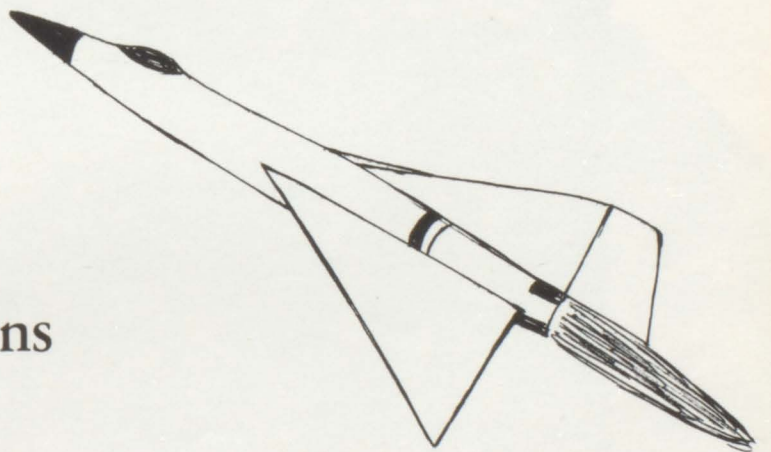

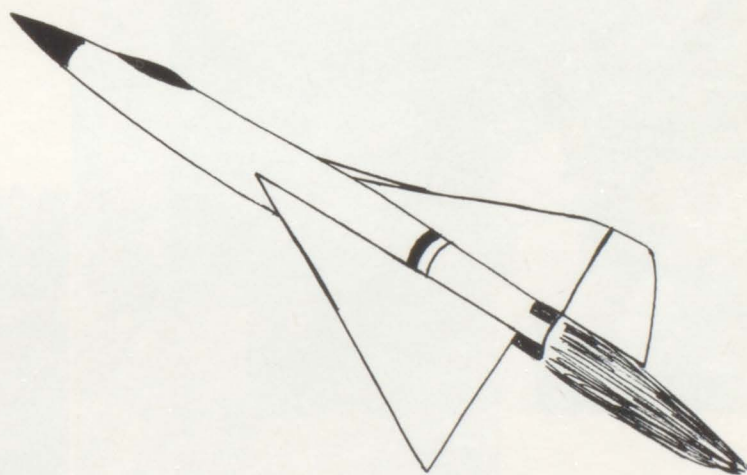

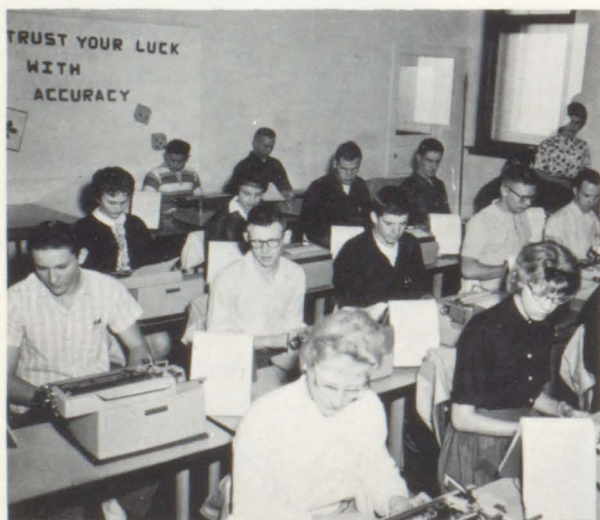

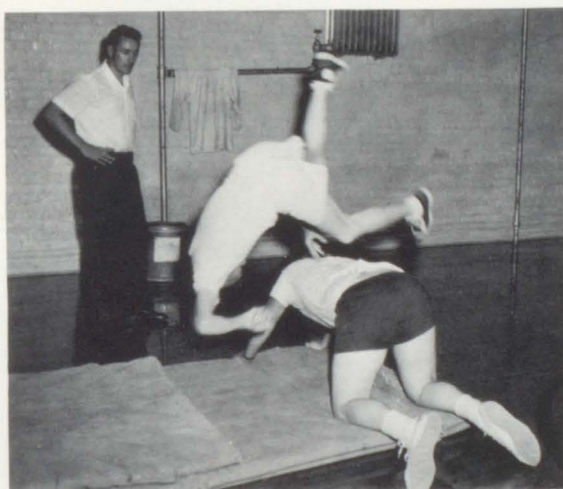

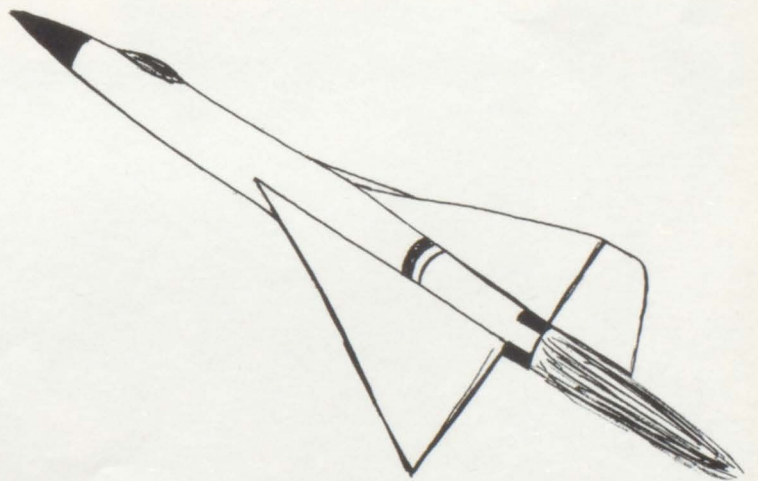
