

Editorial Note 7

Journal, Omaha Indian Agency, September-October 1866

This journal consists of correspondence pertaining to the administrative duties of Furnas as agent at the Omaha Indian Agency. There are letters regarding the procurement of supplies for the reservation; purchase of agricultural equipment; funds for subsistence of tenant Indians; hostilities between Omaha and Winnebago Indians and the appointment of a new agent for the agency.

Omaha Indian Agency
Sept 16th 1866

Sir

Permit me to call your attention to the necessity of immediately rebuilding the Bridge across the Black-Wind, on this Reservation near this Agency. I have written the Department in detail in regard to this matter. But as the Crossing is utterly impossible, I hope you will find it consistent with your duties to authorize the re-building of the Bridge immediately. The Cost will not exceed \$1200: will probably fall short of that.

Sir

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of yours of 27th Sept. enclosing a copy of letter from the Hon. Commissioner of Ind. Affairs, of date Sept 13th 1866 in regard to the expenditure of the \$67,000 due the Indians for lands sold for use of Minnehaha, in which he says "the Agent will be required to state to this office the particular objects for which he proposes to expend said sum, stating the amount necessary for each object."

The provisions of the Treaty of 1851 will be the guide in that matter. It provides that the money referred to "Shall be spent in the purchase of provisions Agricultural implements, stock cattle, & other business exp-

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land" &c Exercising my own judgment
in the case and after consultation with the
Chiefs and head men I respectfully suggest
that the fund be spent as nearly as may be as
follows viz:

The prices above are approximate es-
timated. may fall short or over run. Given
my own knowledge of the wants and desires of the
Omahas, an approximation to the above would
be most beneficial to the Tribe. I therefore re-
commend the same and respectfully ask for
instruction.

Allow me to say at the request of
the Tribe, in regard to the \$1500 provided in
the Treaty for La Glieche, that the Omahas
do not desire any sum of money to be paid
him. They claim that he abdicated his position
and left the Tribe, and that the legitimate
"Value received" or consideration has not been
accrued. I presume however, that as the Treaty
expressly provides that that sum shall
be paid La Glieche that it cannot be
withheld.

The funds with which to pay Farmer, Blacksmith, Ap't. Blacksmith and for iron and tools for Smithy Shop for 3^d for 1866, were received very near the end of the quarter, and as I was un-authorized at the commencement of the quarter to incur those expenditures, and therefore none being incurred I held the funds over for expenditure during the 4th quarter 1866. In my estimate therefore for the 4th quarter 1866 the pay for Farmer & 225 Blacksmiths £225 Ap't Blacksmith £75 Iron Tools & for Shop £150 Total £675 can be withheld.

The Treaty of March 6th 1865, with the
 Orahaas provides that \$50,000 be paid them, to be
 expended for the purchase of Cattle &c as you will be
 by Reference to the Treaty.

I desire, at the request of the Indians to
 purchase at least one Hundred ^{more} Cows for them, out of
 this fund, and it is important that if the purchase is
 made this year it should be made at once. I therefore
 request that you contract with some person to deliver
 at this Agency, as soon as possible the Cows referred to
 above, as it will be nearly if not quite impossible
 to procure them if the purchase be delayed too long
 than Nov 1st besides the price thus day's hence,
 must be much higher than at present.

Hoping that you may yet authorize to
provide the Indians with耽route, in view of the
fact that the Appropriation for that purpose has been
already made. (Am)

Sir

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your favor of this date relative to bad feeling existing and growing between Omahas and Minneconjous.

Simply I have to say that I have already done all in my power to reconcile the difficulty in question, and am at a loss to know what further to do. I have consulted and advised, contrary to my convictions of right that the Omahas comply with the demands of the Minneconjous. And should this be done I am satisfied it will result in establishing a precedent which will result in increased and extravagant demands. A few troublesome Indians are making all this difficulty. I think if they could be promptly and severely punished it would end the matter. I know of no way of disposing of this vexed question, than to lay all the facts before either the Dept. Superintendent, and then be governed by instructions.

I will either join you in a joint statement of facts, in relation to these difficulties to either the Dept. or Commissioner, or let each agent of these respective tribes present the case as you may determine.

The Indians must be made to know that they will not be permitted to violate fundamental Treaty stipulations by resorting to force at pleasure, to redress either real or imaginary wrongs, and even threats of that kind, in my opinion, should meet with prompt punishment.

If you really think there is danger of a conflict, I hope you will immediately communicate with me, and I will at once call upon the military authority for assistance.
